LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FRIENDS OF ANIMALS

On behalf of our organization, we would like to thank you for your support. You have provided us with the opportunity to continue our mission to help the dogs and cats of Moore County, TN while also educating and assisting our residents on the importance of spay and neuter. 2022 came with a growing need for help with the stray/homeless dogs and cats in Moore County. We received many requests for help in regards to stray animals, abandoned animals, and even owner surrenders. While we do our absolute best to answer these cries for help, the lack of space, fosters, and volunteer staff continue to limit our ability to be able to assist with all calls.

2022 alone brought 187 animals through our shelter, not including the ones that were already in our care at the beginning of the year. Of this 187, there were 96 cats and 91 dogs. This does not include the multiple daily phone calls from people with animals that we were not able to assist and the multiple animals that we posted to find their homes. We work very hard to find safe outlets for these animals through adoptions and transporting to other rescues that do not face the same overcrowding issues as our state. In 2022, 79 animals were saved by transporting them North to shelters that were needing animals to adopt out. These shelters were located in multiple states and even in another country: Canada, Wisconsin, New York, and so on. 2022 also brought along 84 adoptions to wonderful families. Due to the high volume and seemingly endless 'kitten season', we had to remodel and expand our kitten room. This gave us the opportunity to help more in need.

We always look forward to participating in the community events that we can like Spring in the Hollow and Jack Daniel's BBQ. These events make it possible to meet new friends, catch up with old friends, and spread awareness about the work we do within the community. Our annual fundraisers were a success and we were able to add one major fundraiser with the help from Jordan's Way, a fundraising team that tours the nation visiting shelters to raise money! With these fundraisers and the help of our generous donors, we were able to make it through the year.

We continued our spay/neuter efforts with our community spay/neuter program, 'Penny's Promise'. With the help of a grant from The Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee, we were able to mail postcards about our assistance program to all residents in our county. We created vouchers for 121 personal animals to be spayed/neutered and receive their Rabies vaccine. We were also able to spay/neuter 45 feral cats living within our community, preventing MANY litters of kittens.

We are proud of our accomplishments in the year, and will always strive to achieve higher goals in the year to come. Thanks to all of our supporters, we are able to set these goals and work toward them.

DONATIONS AND FUNDRAISING



VOLUNTEERS & FOSTERS

It hurts all of our hearts... we can't save them all. we can't even rescue them all. We have limited space and limited number of volunteers to care for them. So when puppy and kitten season starts... so does the increase in phone calls. An average of five to ten phone calls a day. Litters upon litters of rescuable animals, with no where to put them or enough people to care for them. We take as many as we can safely, sanely manage, but it never feels like enough.

One director and a small team of consistent volunteers make up the entire staff at Friends of Animals. Any day that the scheduled volunteer

doesn't show up means that

Brandi has to feed the dogs and cats, clean the kennels as well as all the cat rooms by herself... **BEFORE** she can return calls and work on all her other duties of vetting, adoption, transport. coordination of Community Spay and Neuters, TNR...

but without her dedicat-

ed volunteers and a handful

of fosters, her job would be impossible. Every bit of assistance is welcomed and appreciate, as well as an angel volunteer who bottle feeds abandoned kittens.

In 2022, we were blessed to add Missy Laws as a part-time employee to help Brandi with the overwhelming tasks she needs to attend to each day.

CHIP (NOW KNOWN AS VICTOR):


(Above) Was found almost lifeless on the side of the road. After a long road of healing and TLC, he is now living his happiest life with one of our volunteers.

FASTER

A litter of three puppies dumped in the Ridgeville subdivision and three adult dogs dumped at Lost Creek boat ramp all on Easter. Puppies and one adult dog were adopted, the other two adult dogs went to rescues in New York and Canada.

SPAY & NEUTER PROGRAM

This is Rescue Reality every Spring to early Summer, and sometimes again in the Fall. Multiple animals in the community are not being fixed and commonly roam, then it rains cats and dogs, or literally kittens and puppies. After nine years, it hasn't changed in Moore County and sometimes it feels worse.

Friends of Animals has been trying to resolve this issue for years.


In 2022. we continued our community spay/neuter program, "Penny's Promise. With the help of a grant from The Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee, we were able to mail postcards about our assistance program to all residents in our county. We created vouchers for 121 personal animals to be spayed/neutered and receive their Rabies vaccine.

This year we used the money from Metro Moore County to help fund the community S/N program. It is helping residents struggling with feral cat overpopulation and dumped dogs in their area.



ESLICK ROAD PUPPIES: A litter of seven puppies abandoned in a resident's barn. Her son heard them while waiting for the bus. Homeowner does not know where they came from and does not have any close neighbors.

TNR

In 2022 we continued our TNR program using six of the recommended premium traps used by other TNR programs. We started a separate account to keep grants and other funds from co-mingling with our FoA operations. This is a highly suggested practice, because with some grants, if you do not fulfill your objectives, the money must be returned. All of the Donation Jar monies go in to this account.

Brandi has recorded 16 parts of the county that call regularly in regards to feral cat complaints. Last year, Brandi and some volunteers (who helped for a short time) targeted specific areas one at a time, starting with a neighborhood near downtown Lynchburg. The feral cats are fed in the designated area; traps were set; and caught cats were transported to a clinic to be tested, fixed, vaccinated, and ear tipped. It is no small task and more volunteers are needed to make this program a success. We also have a trap loan program for others to catch cats in their areas.

RESCUE AND ADOPTIONS

The heart of Friends of Animals is the rescue work we do. Saving animals from dire circumstances happens way too often and can drain a rescuer's soul. But saving them and seeing them adopted into the right family and situation can sustain us for weeks.

In 2022, we adopted out 84 animals. All FoA animals leave fully vetted, up to date on shots, microchipped and spayed or neutered. If the animal is too young, a voucher is sent with them for the service to be done at an appropriate age. The minimal adoption fee we charge does not pay for everything we do for the adopted animal.

In some instances, the animals we save require emergency surgery, expensive heartworm treatments or other

vetting that is outside

the norm.

Because of the quantity of animals that come through our doors it is necessary to find homes for the animals outside of Moore County. In fact, a large amount are adopted out of state through PetFinder and other similar Apps.

Another solution is making use of Transports with other area rescues. There is more of a demand in northern states for dogs and cats because of the stricter animal laws regarding licensing and spay and neuter. In 2022, we partnered with other rescues and saved 79 more lives.

At the end of 2022, we still had 21 animals in our care...

CASS: A pregnant stray that showed up and give birth to a litter of seven at a residence. She went to a local rescue partner who added her and her babies to their transport.




